A Letter from our President

Dear Friends of WIA,

This year reminded us, once again, of the extraordinary power of community. Across borders, time zones, and job titles, our members came together with creativity, resilience, and care. We welcomed thousands of new voices into the WIA family, witnessed the spark of mentorship light up careers worldwide, and saw firsthand how shared purpose can drive real, lasting change.

At a time when many felt isolated, uncertain, or overwhelmed, WIA provided connection and clarity. And that is something to celebrate.

But it would be disingenuous not to acknowledge the broader landscape in which all this progress occurred. The animation, VFX, and gaming industries are facing some of the most difficult conditions in recent memory, marked by instability, economic pressure, and ongoing labor challenges. In the U.S. and abroad, we've also seen a distressing backlash against diversity, equity, and inclusion work, challenging the very principles we know are essential to a thriving, representative creative industry.

On a deeply personal note, we also mourned the loss of our dear friend and board member, **Fumi Kitahara**, whose generous spirit and unwavering dedication helped shape WIA into what it is today. And for many in our community, the **LA Fires** were a devastating reminder of how fragile and interconnected our lives and livelihoods truly are.

Still, we kept going.

We welcomed **3,000** new members, growing our global community to more than **17,000** strong. We expanded our international reach through new *Chapters*, *Collectives and Connects* in Ireland, Colombia, Australia, and the UK—bringing WIA's mission to more corners of the world and deepening our impact.

Our **Mentorship Circles program** flourished, supporting over **100 circles** and empowering participants through peer learning, shared experience, and expert guidance. We also **awarded over \$100,000** in scholarships and grants,

\$92,000 in-kind, and **\$18,500 in cash** to 55 deserving recipients whose stories inspire us and whose futures we proudly support.

And in honor of our beloved Fumi, we launched the **Fumi Kitahara Membership & Scholarship Fund**—a lasting tribute that will continue opening doors for those who need them most.

We also completed a bold **brand refresh**, updating our visual identity to better reflect who we are today: a forward-looking, globally connected movement working to create opportunity, drive access, and increase representation for all marginalized genders in animation, VFX, and gaming.

And finally, we returned to the Annecy International Animation Film Festival for our **9th Annual World Summit**, where our full-day symposium, *The Future is Animated*, brought together industry leaders, creatives, and advocates to explore equity and innovation across our intersecting fields.

This year, more than ever, we were reminded that progress is not linear. But WIA has always been about more than programs or milestones; it's about people. It's about showing up for each other. And it's about the unshakable belief that by working together, we can reshape this industry into one that reflects the richness, diversity, and brilliance of everyone within it.

Thank you for standing with us and believing in what's possible. The road ahead may not be easy, but we are walking it together, and we are not turning back.

Since then, WIA has grown from just 120 members to more than 17,000 and has evolved into the leading organization dedicated to advancing gender equity in the animation, VFX, and gaming industries.

We envision a world in which people of all gender identities share fully in the creation, production, and rewards of animation, resulting in richer and more diverse entertainment and media that move our culture forward.

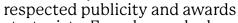
Remembering Fumi

We remember with deep affection and gratitude our dear friend and longtime board member, Fumi Kitahara. More than an outstanding publicist and strategist, Fumi was the heart of so many gatherings, a wise and cheerful presence who made everyone feel welcome. Her passing leaves a void in our community, but her radiant spirit continues to inspire us all.

For more than 10 years, Fumi was WIA's PR Chair. With her incredible knack for connection and storytelling, she was instrumental in sharing our mission with the world. Whether at the Annecy International Animation Film Festival or in a quiet planning session, she gave so generously of her time and brilliance, always driven by her belief in a more equitable and inclusive animation industry.

"WIA would not be where we are today without her extraordinary and relentless work," said Jinko Gotoh, Vice President of WIA and fellow Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences colleague. Gotoh noted Kitahara helped spotlight WIA's work and mission at the Annecy International Animation Film Festival. "She was the ultimate connector to the media as well as the ideal Annecy ambassador for our World Summit."

Beyond her incredible advocacy at WIA, Fumi's career spanned more than three decades. She was a driving force behind some of the most iconic animated films and shorts, earning her a reputation as one of the industry's most



strategists. From her early days on classics like "The Lion King" and "Toy Story" at Disney, to helping introduce the world to DreamWorks' "Shrek," to her recent work on Oscar-winning Guillermo del Toro's "Pinocchio," she believed in the power of animation to connect us all.

Our hearts go out to her family, whom she spoke of with so much love and pride. She was a gift to our community, and we will strive to mirror her generosity, passion, and light for many years to come.



To honor Fumi's impact on our industry and community, we established the Fumi Kitahara Membership and Scholarship Fund. This fund will ensure that her generous spirit continues to open doors for future generations.

Scholarship

The WIA Scholarship Program continues to support the next generation of creatives who exhibit exceptional artistic talent, a deep passion for animation, VFX, and gaming, financial need, and a promising future in the industry. Thanks to the generous contributions from our sponsors, the program has expanded significantly, offering students financial aid and invaluable resources like software, hardware, workshops, and tutoring opportunities.

We received 183 applications from students across 15 **countries** — nearly double from the previous year — and 74 schools. Our recipients reflect the diversity of the animation community, with 73% identifying as women, 16% as nonbinary, and 1% as transgender, alongside a wide range of racial and ethnic backgrounds.

The WIA Scholarship Program underscores our commitment to nurturing emerging talent and highlights the bright future of the animation industry.

World Summit 2025

This year, we wrapped up another successful WIA World Summit at the Annecy International Animation Film Festival. The 350-person venue was filled to capacity throughout the day, with attendees engaged in discussions led by industry leaders.

This ninth annual Summit, themed "The Future is Animated," spotlighted emerging innovations, inclusive storytelling, and gender equity as driving forces in animation. The energy in the room reflected the industry's hunger for change, with representation from diverse genders, races, and nationalities, united by a shared commitment to shaping a more equitable creative landscape.

The Summit's impact extended far beyond the event space, with media coverage in *Variety*, *Cartoon Brew*, and *Animation Magazine* amplifying our message to a global audience.

Each year, the WIA World Summit at Annecy reaffirms that when we champion equity and community, we don't just change animation — we redefine what's possible.

This year, seven talented women making up five teams were selected for the 2025 Stories x Women cohort. First launched in 2022, the groundbreaking initiative fosters diversity in animation by supporting women creators from emerging film communities across Africa, Asia-Pacific, and Latin America. Run in collaboration with FIAPF and sponsored by The Walt Disney Company and UNESCO, this year the program received 114 eligible applications from over 100 countries — a testament to the global demand for inclusive storytelling.

The selected teams benefited from mentorship by acclaimed animation experts and 1:1 coaching to refine their projects. This culminated in pitch opportunities at Annecy 2025's MIFA market. Their presentations took center stage on June 10 in the Haendel Room, amplifying authentic narratives on the world stage.

This year's cohort represented bold visions from Brazil (Better City), Bolivia (Condenaditos), India (Jinnbusters), South Africa (Nerve), and Turkey (The Brains). By centering women-led creative teams, Stories x Women continued its mission to break barriers and help amplify women's stories and voices in animation.

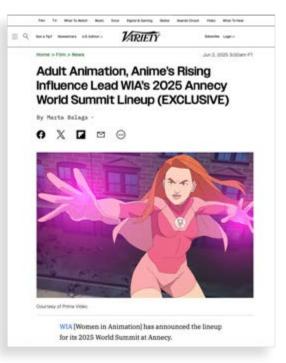

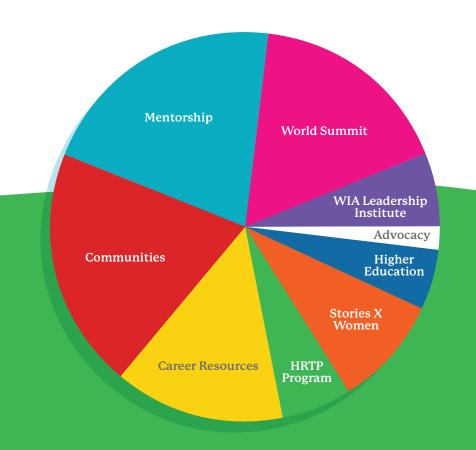
